The first Onkel Hans Food Drive donation opportunity will be this Friday, October 4th at the Kitchener Rangers vs. Flint Firebirds game. Donations can be dropped off at the GRT bus outside the Kitchener Memorial Auditorium between 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m.

The second Onkel Hans Food Drive donation opportunity will be on Saturday, October 5th. Community members are encouraged to drop off nonperishable food items or money donations between 9:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. at the Laurentian Zehrs located at 750 Ottawa Street South in Kitchener and between 1:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. at the Conestoga Mall Zehrs located at 555 Davenport Road in Waterloo.

Onsite entertainment with K-W Oktoberfest's WunderWagen will be at both Zehrs locations for all to enjoy.

"With food costs continuing to rise, more of community neighbours need our support," shares Tracy Van Kalsbeek, Executive Director of Kitchener-Waterloo Oktoberfest. "If you're unable to contribute to the Onkel Hans Food Drive Stuff a Bus campaign, we encourage you to join us at the K-W Oktoberfest Thanksgiving Day Parade on Monday, October 14th. Every food and cash donation makes a difference."

Nonperishable food items and cash donations will be collected along the Parade route by Onkel Hans Food Drive volunteer crews. Parade goers will find donation trucks at the beginning of the parade led by the 2024 K-W Oktoberfest Ambassador, Allie Steffler along with 2025 Ambassador candidates as well as at the end of the parade.
